

The Frayer Model

Definition	Characteristics
<p>Student-friendly description of the term (usually provided by your teacher)</p>	<p>Facts or features that help you recognize, identify, or distinguish the term</p>
term	
Examples	Nonexamples
<p>An example must be:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• A specific, real-world application of the term• Something that fits all of the characteristics of the term	<p>A nonexample must be:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• An incorrect, or inappropriate, real-world application of the term• Related to the term but not an example of the term• Something that does not fit all of the characteristics of the term

Example of a Completed Frayer Model

Definition	Characteristics
Control; dominate	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Dominate someone• Force people to do what you want• Take control and ignore others' opinions

Examples	Nonexamples
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The military threatening to hurt others if they don't do what they are told• A king ordering those in his kingdom to pay more taxes	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• A teacher disciplining a class• A soccer coach telling his team how to play• A city leader elected by citizens describing new laws
